SMILE will be available to all French Higher Education institutions to facilitate and dematerialise the administrative procedures related to incoming exchange students, in accordance with the Erasmus Without Paper directives.

- Access to the online course catalogue of the host university
- · Automatic edition of the Online Learning Agreement and electronic signature
- · Pre-registration
- · Automatic conversion of transcript of records

- Makes data exchanges more secured and information updated in real time
- Connects to the entire digital environment (EWP, dashboard, providers...)
